Self-Managers	Be Organised Keep a record of wildlife that visits your garden or a family member's garden that you visit.	Manage Emotions Find out how different styles of music affect the way you feel. Which genre energises you? Which calms you?
Effective Participators	Get Involved The Landulph Festival of Music and Arts takes place throughout October. Visit one of the events and report back through photos or your own writing or pictures to tell us all about it.	Persuade Others Run for School Council! Write a manifesto that helps people to understand that you are the best person for the job. Present your ideas to your classmates and persuade them to vote for you.
Creative Thinkers	Imagine Draw a map of an imaginary island. Think of features that are labelled on maps that we have looked at in Geography.	Question Assumptions Our PSHE lessons focus on two children from Malawi. Find out information about Malawi to share with the school.
Reflective Learners	Share Learning Share the story of Cormoran the giant and how he and his wife built St Michael's Mount. Perhaps one weekend you could even visit it!	Set Yourself Challenges Use at least 5 different materials to create a junk model giant.
Enquirers	Explore a Question How many other stories can you find with a character named Jack who fights a giant?	Evaluate Evidence Collect some rocks from the beach. Can you identify if they are sedimentary, igneous, or metamorphic?
Team Worker	Take Responsibility Using your knowledge of different materials, help to sort out the recycling into the different bags and boxes one week	Manage the Team Find out about and play different games that require attack and defence. (Football, hockey, chess)
